

Summary Page – Preventing the spread of COVID-19 on camp and the role of the School’s Good Hygiene Officer/ Nominated COVID Marshal



For Schools & Teachers

Before Camp

- Tell students about COVID-19 in an age appropriate way and the importance of good hygiene especially handwashing after coughing or sneezing, before eating or touching food, after using the toilet, after playing outside, after touching hands with other people.
- Follow Govt Advice so that students who are ill are not at school and are not allowed to go on camp (see attachment and link to website <https://www.health.gov.au/resources/publications/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-schools-and-early-childhood-centres>)
- Read Active Ed’s Preventing the Spread of COVID -19 on Camp
- Assign and brief the school’s “Good Hygiene Officer/Nominated COVID Marshal” who should undertake the Nominated COVID Marshal training which takes about 30 mins to complete <https://www.covid-19.sa.gov.au/recovery/covid-marshals>

During Camp – “Good Hygiene Officer/ Nominated COVID Marshal”

- All school staff and adults on camp will need be vigilant and support good hygiene practices with students throughout the duration of the camp
- The Good Hygiene Officer/ Nominated COVID Marshal will be responsible for the following on camp
 - a) Sanitising taps in toilet areas before and after breaks using the sanitiser provided
 - b) Sanitising taps and surfaces in the washing up area as required using the sanitiser provided
 - c) Sanitising tables and chairs in the dining area before and after each meal time
 - d) Ensuring students thoroughly wash their hands before meals and after playing outside
 - e) Ensuring students line up for hand sanitiser application before lining up for food at all meal and snack times
 - f) Ensuring only adults wearing gloves are drying and putting away items after they have been washed after mealtimes (students can scrape plates and put into dishwasher only)
 - g) Ensuring only adult(s) wearing gloves are stationed at the water container(s) to fill student water bottles before activities and mealtimes

After Camp

- Follow the advice of Health Officials if someone becomes ill with COVID-19
- Please advise Active Education if someone becomes ill with COVID-19 within 14 days of camp

For Active Education

Before Camp

- Active Ed will supply sanitiser and gloves during the camp.
- Active Ed will provide procedures for staff to follow during camps
- Active Ed will liaise with campsite managers regarding their sanitising procedures between camps
- Active Ed staff will have completed the Nominated COVID Marshal training

During Camp

- Whilst on duty on camp there will be an Active Ed staff member who be a Nominated COVID Marshal working in conjunction with the school’s Good Hygiene Officer/ Nominated COVID Marshal
- Program staff will focus on good hygiene practices during the initial briefing after arrival on camp
- Program staff will ensure equipment and activity areas are sanitised before and after every activity
- Catering staff will ensure kitchen and serving areas are sanitised before and after every meal or snack break

After Camp

- Follow the advice of Health Officials if someone becomes ill with COVID-19
- Active Ed will advise schools and stakeholders if someone becomes ill with COVID-19 within 14 days of camp

For Campsite Managers

- Ensure effective cleaning and sanitising of toilet, bathroom, sleeping areas and dining areas before and after each camp. The daily cleaning of high traffic and touchpoint areas is recommended.
- Professional cleaning of carpets & removal of mattresses may be required (to stop transmission to subsequent groups using campsite facilities).

After Camp

- Follow the advice of Health Officials if someone becomes ill with COVID-19
- Please advise Active Education if someone who has attended the campsite is diagnosed with COVID-19 within 14 days of our camp booking
